Admin. Law Judges' Decisions Rendered - Appeals from Employers by Issue

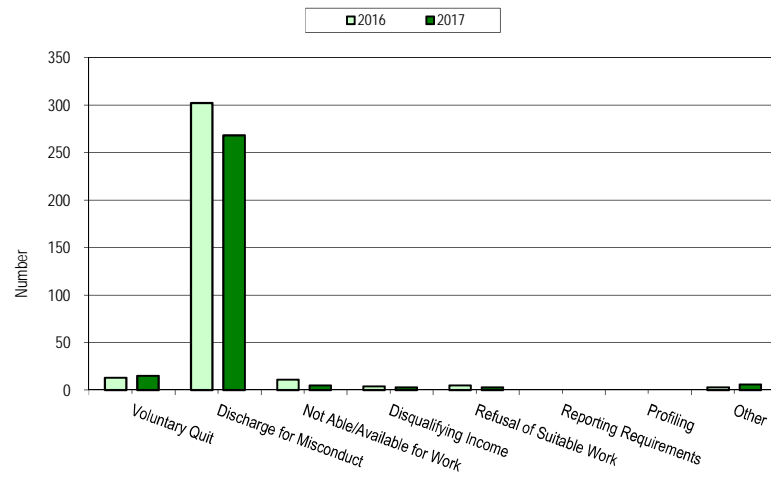
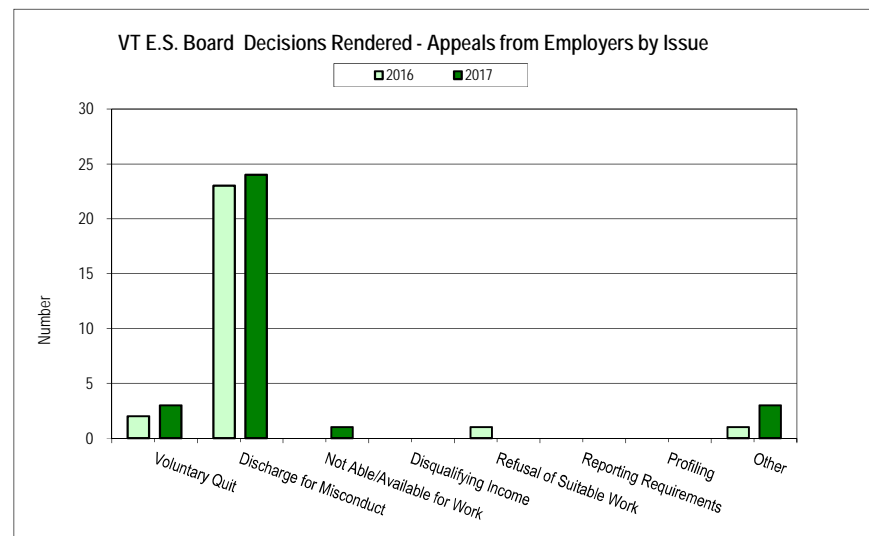
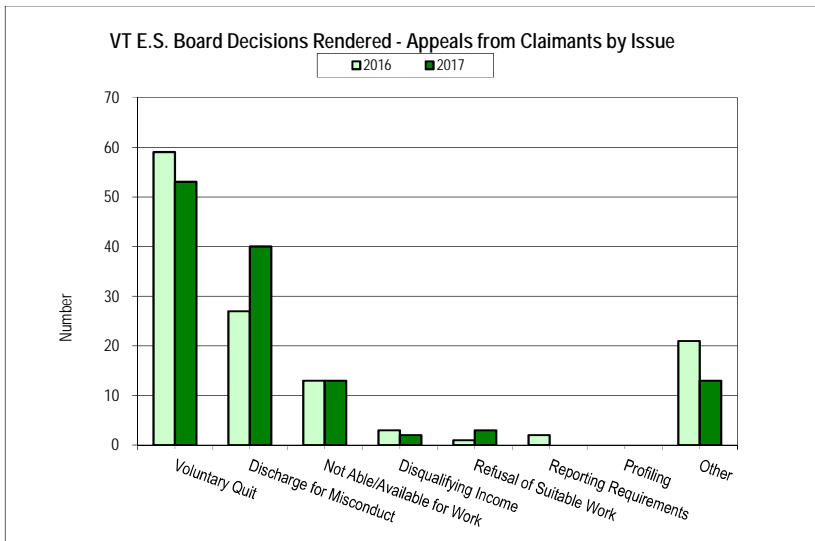

Glossary of Unemployment Compensation Terms

<i>Agent State</i>	The state in which a claimant files an interstate claim for benefits against another (liable) state where wages were earned.
<i>Benefits</i>	The monetary amount paid to an unemployed or partially unemployed worker.
<i>Claimant</i>	A totally or partially unemployed individual who has filed a claim for unemployment benefits.
<i>Combined-Wage-Claim</i>	A claim filed in one State against wage credits earned in two or more States.
<i>Continued Claim</i>	A claim filed by mail or in person for waiting period credit or payment for one or more weeks of unemployment.
<i>Decision</i>	The disposition of an appeals case by a written ruling issued to one or more parties. A disposition may or may not involve a review of a previous decision.
<i>Determination</i>	An official decision by the Department of Labor (DOL) regarding the unemployment claim of an individual or the tax status of an employer.
<i>Separation Determination:</i>	An official decision issued by the Unemployment Insurance and Wages Division that determines if the reason for separation from the last employer is qualifying to receive unemployment insurance benefits. Common separation determinations include: voluntary quit, gross misconduct and discharge.
<i>Nonseparation Determination:</i>	An official decision issued by the Unemployment Insurance and Wages Division that determines eligibility for a unemployment insurance benefit for reason unassociated with reason for separation, such as the claimant's able and availability, refusal of work, receipt of disqualifying income (vacation pay, wages in lieu of notice, or severance pay), reporting requirements, profiling and other issues.
<i>Disqualification</i>	State law specifies claimants are disqualified from benefits for a definite or indefinite period. These include voluntarily leaving employment without good cause; discharge for misconduct, felony, or gross misdemeanor; misrepresentation; refusal to work; participating in a labor dispute which results in work stoppage; and full-time attendance at school.
<i>Eligibility Conditions</i>	Those conditions prescribed by law under which an individual may receive benefits.
<i>Eligibility Determination</i>	A determination as to whether a claimant meets all of the eligibility conditions prescribed by law.
<i>Eligibility</i>	A Federal Unemployment Program for which the Federal Government pays 100% of the extended benefits paid, which must be authorized by Congress.
<i>Extended Benefits (EB)</i>	A state Unemployment Program for which the Federal Government reimburses the state 50% of the extended benefits paid.
<i>Interstate Combined-Wage</i>	A combined-wage claim in which the paying State is not the State in which the claim is filed and the interstate claims procedures are used in making the
<i>Intrastate Combined-Wage</i>	A combined-wage claim in which the paying State is also the State in which the claim is filed and to which the other State or States will transfer wage credits.
<i>Liable State</i>	Any State against which a worker files a claim for compensation through the facilities of another (agent) State.
<i>Monetary Determination</i>	A written notice issued to inform an individual whether or not the individual meets the employment and wage requirements necessary to establish entitlement to compensation under a specific program and, if entitled, the weekly and maximum benefit amounts the individual may receive.
<i>Nonmonetary Redetermination</i>	A decision made under statute, regulation, or well-defined policy specifically requiring the reopening of a nonmonetary determination before the administrative appeal stage, and which affirms, reverses, or modifies such determination.
<i>VT E.S. Board</i>	The second level of appeal is to the Vermont Employment Security Board, the first being the Administrative Law Judge.
